Welcome to the English Riviera Geopark and a landscape of dramatic changes, revealing stories unseen elsewhere in the world. Scratch beneath the surface and our landscape reveals tales of tropical seas and scorching deserts, raised beaches and drowned forests, hippopotami, mammoths, sabre-toothed tigers and earliest man.

Situated within the stunning, rolling hills of South Devon, our geology has created the beautiful coastline we see today, linking the rich diversity of landscape with wildlife, people and culture.

In September 2007, the English Riviera received international recognition for its geological, historical and cultural heritage and became one of just 57 areas around the world – and the only urban area - to be endorsed by **UNESCO** as a Global Geopark. There are a number of key gateway sites to explore, which you can find detailed on the map enclosed.
